



Addendum – Assertive Discipline Policy

This addendum applies until further notice.

Unless covered in this addendum, our normal Assertive Discipline Policy continues to apply.

We may need to amend or add to this addendum as circumstances or official guidance changes. We will communicate any changes to staff, parents and pupils.

Expectations for pupils in school

New rules

When pupils are in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below to keep themselves and the rest of the school community safe.

Staff will be familiar with these rules and make sure they are followed consistently.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure that their children follow the new procedures that have been put in place. Parents should contact the Principal, Ms Virk, if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules so we can consider alternative arrangements with them.

Reasonable adjustments will be made for pupils with more challenging behaviour or SEND needs and individual risk assessments undertaken.

Pupils must -

- use the one way system in and around school
- wait outside of school at the start of the day to be collected by their teacher
- on entry to school wash/sanitise their hands
- try to keep 2 metres from adults and remain in their 'bubbles'
- use 'catch it, bin it, kill it' when coughing and sneezing and avoiding touching their mouth, nose and eyes with their hands
- not share any equipment or other items, including drinking bottles unless sanitised by staff
- ask to use the toilet and wash hands after using
- not have physical contact with others
- not cough or spit at or towards any other person

Sanctions for not following rules

If pupils repeatedly fail to follow these rules, school will follow stage 1-3 sanctions as set out in our Assertive Discipline Policy

Expectations for pupils at home

Remote Learning Rules

If pupils are not in school, we expect them to follow all of the rules set out below.

Parents should also read the rules and ensure their children follow them. Parents should contact the Principal, Ms Virk, if they think their child might not be able to comply with some or all of the rules, so we can consider alternative arrangements with them.

Pupils must -

- be contactable during required times
- complete work to the deadline set by teachers
- seek help if they need it, from teachers or teaching assistants

- alert teachers if they're not able to complete work
- use proper online conduct, such as using appropriate language in messages

Dealing with problems

If there are problems with pupils adhering to rules around remote learning, including if they don't engage with the remote learning set for them, school will make contact with parents/carers and reinforce our expectations.

Monitoring arrangements

We will review this policy as guidance from the Department for Education is updated.
