School Uniform Policy

1. Aims

1.1 This policy aims to:

- Set out our approach to requiring a uniform that is of reasonable cost and offers the best value for money for parents and carers
- Explain how we will avoid discrimination in line with our legal duties under the Equality Act 2010
- Clarify our expectations for School uniform.

2. Our School's legal duties under the Equality Act 2010

2.1 The Equality Act 2010 prohibits discrimination against an individual based on the protected characteristics, which include sex, race, religion or belief, and gender reassignment.

2.2 To avoid discrimination, our School will:

- Avoid listing uniform items based on sex, to give all pupils the opportunity to wear the uniform they feel most comfortable in or that most reflects their self-identified gender
- Make sure that our uniform expectations, and thus costs, are the same for all pupils within the school
- Allow all pupils to have long hair (though we reserve the right to ask for this to be tied back) and coloured hair (as deemed appropriate by the School).
- Allow an inclusive environment by adopting The Equality and Human Rights Commission's guidance on preventing hair discrimination in schools.
- Allow pupils to request changes to swimwear for religious reasons. Schools will consider
 each request individually and make reasonable adjustments where possible. It will remain
 the School's decision to allow any change
- Allow pupils to wear headscarves and other religious or cultural symbols
- Allow for potential adaptations to our policy on the grounds of equality and protected characteristics by asking pupils or their parents to contact Jennie Henson, who can answer questions about the policy and respond to any requests

3. Limiting the cost of school uniform

- **3.1** Our school has a duty to make sure that the uniform we require is affordable, in line with statutory guidance from the Department for Education on the cost of school uniform.
- **3.2** We understand that items with distinctive characteristics (such as branded items, or items that must have a school logo or a unique fabric/colour/design) cannot be purchased from a wide range of retailers and may limit parents' ability to 'shop around' for a low price.

3.3 With this in mind, we will make sure that our uniform:

- Is available at a reasonable cost
- Limits the number of branded items required to three (secondary schools are permitted a fourth branded item, if it is a branded tie)
- Provides the best value for money for parents/carers

3.4 We will do this by:

- Limiting any items with distinctive characteristics where possible: for example, by only asking that the blazer features the School logo
- Limiting items with distinctive characteristics to low-cost or long-lasting items, such as ties and blazers
- Avoiding specific requirements for items pupils could wear on non-School days, such as coats, bags and shoes
- Keeping the number of optional branded items to a minimum including PE kit
- Avoiding different uniform requirements for different year/class/house group and for extracurricular activities
- Avoiding frequent changes to uniform specifications and minimising the financial impact on parents of any changes
- Ensuring that uniform supplier arrangements give the highest priority to cost and value for money (including the quality and durability of the garment).
- Making sure that arrangements are in place for parents to acquire second-hand uniform items
- Consulting with parents and pupils on any proposed significant changes to the uniform policy and carefully considering any complaints about the policy

4. Expectations for School uniform

4.1 Our School's uniform

- Royal blue sweatshirt/jumper (with or without school logo)
- White polo t-shirt/shirt
- Black or grey trousers
- Black or grey skirt/pinafore
- Plain dark tights
- Black, flat shoes (plain black trainers are acceptable, but should not contain large or multicoloured logos, soles or laces)

Due to limited space within the cloakroom areas, we ask that children refrain from bringing in large rucksacks. Instead, we highly encourage a small backpack.

No jewellery should be worn at school except for religious purposes, medic-alert tags, a simple watch and/or stud earrings. No jewellery should be worn during P.E. or swimming lessons, except for medic-alert tags.

PE Kit

- Suitable and appropriate t-shirt
- P.E shorts, jogging bottoms/leggings
- Sport trainers or plimsolls
- We request that your child has a waterproof coat with them in school on any day when it may be required.

Swimming Kit

- Swimsuits/trunks/wet suits
- Towel
- Suitable footwear to walk to the outside pool area from the changing room

4.2 Where to purchase it

• Uniform can be purchased from local high street retailers without the school logo

Second-hand uniform

 At given times of the year, the school hosts a 'Swap Shop' – this is an opportunity for parents to come to school to purchase/collect second hand uniform. These are advertised through school communications (Classroom Dojo)

5. Expectations for our School community

5.1

Our pupils wear Rowlatts Mead Academy uniform with pride. The uniform is an important part of our school's identity and standing within our community. We ask that pupils wear their uniform correctly at all times, including:

- On School premises
- Travelling to and from School
- At out-of-School events or on trips that are organised by the School, or where they are representing Rowlatts Mead Academy (if required)

Pupils are also expected to contact Mrs Henson if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to their protected characteristics.

5.2 Parents and carers

We ask that parents and carers work in partnership with the School by ensuring that their child has the correct uniform and PE kit, and that every item is:

- Clean
- Clearly labelled with the child's name
- In good condition

Parents are also expected to contact Mrs Henson if they want to request an amendment to the uniform policy in relation to:

- Their child's protected characteristics
- The cost of the uniform

The School is committed to working with parents to resolve any concerns regarding School uniform. Parents are expected to lodge any complaints or objections relating to the School uniform in a timely and reasonable manner and the School will work closely with parents to arrive at a mutually acceptable outcome. Any disputes about the cost of uniform will be:

Dealt with in accordance with our Trust's complaints policy

5.3 The School

The School will ensure that the expectations for students/ pupils/ scholars/ pupil and for parents and carers are clearly communicated; the School uniform policy will be published on the School's website, and be made available for all parents, including parents of prospective pupils/students/scholars.

To support parents and families the School will:

- assess the overall cost implications of the uniform policy for parents and carers
- ensure that uniform supplier arrangements give the highest priority to cost and value for money (including the quality and durability of the garment).
- put in place arrangements for parents and carers to acquire second-hand uniform items

The School will work proactively with parents and pupils to ensure that uniform expectations are met. Where a pupil student is not wearing the expected uniform, the School will put in place support to rectify this, for example through the loaning of uniform. Where accessing uniform is not a barrier and where appropriate, the School will apply the use of sanctions as outlined in the school behaviour policy.

6. Monitoring arrangements

6.1 This policy will be reviewed every 2 years by our Schools Director. At every review, it will be approved by the Executive Team.
